- Maintaining workplaces under its control in a safe and healthy condition;
- Ensuring effective measures are in place to control hazards and risks;
- Providing adequate facilities, equipment and protective clothing for the welfare of all employees;
- Providing the information, instruction, training and supervision necessary for all employees, enabling them to work in a safe, healthy and efficient manner.

Mallee CMA Employees and Service Providers will at all times:

- Take reasonable care for their own health and safety and that of others who may be affected by their actions (or lack of actions) at work;
- Co-operate with the Mallee CMA's efforts to meet its responsibilities by following the systems and procedures of work necessary for safe and healthy operations and, when required, participate in appropriate training;
- Report to their Manager, Supervisor or Health and Safety Representative the hazards, risks, incidents and OHS&W concerns of which they are aware.

The Mallee CMA recognises the objectives of this statement can best be achieved through effective consultation, communication and co-operation between managers, supervisors, employees, service providers and internal and external stakeholders, working together.
